Law

2-15-242. State poet laureate.

- (1) There is a state poet laureate.
- (2) Within 30 days prior to the expiration of the state poet laureate's term of appointment or within 30 days after a vacancy in the position occurs, the Montana arts council established in **22-2-101** shall nominate three individuals to be the state poet laureate. The Montana arts council shall provide the list of nominees to the Governor who shall:
 - (a) within 30 days after receiving the list of nominees, appoint the state poet laureate from among the individuals named on the list; and
 - (b) notify the secretary of state and the Montana arts council of the appointment.
- (3) The individual named by the Governor as the state poet laureate shall serve for a term of 2 years beginning on the date of appointment by the Governor.
- (4) The state poet laureate is an honorary position, and the person serving as the state poet laureate may not receive any compensation from the state for serving as the state poet laureate.

Process

Criteria

- Artistic excellence and achievement
- Ongoing contributions to the cultural community
- Worthiness of statewide recognition

Eligibility

- Poet must be a resident of Montana for at least one year.
- Poet may not be a member of the Montana Arts Council, its staff, or their immediate family or household.

Nomination

- Public call for nominations
- Accepted through a web-based survey or hard copy, to include:
 - Poet information
 - Nominator information
 - o Favorite poem and why, 600 character narrative
 - o Reason poet is deserving of the honor, 600 character narrative
- Nominated poets indicate their intention to accept through web-based or hard copy submission, to include:
 - Contact information
 - o Resume or bio
 - Three poems

Review

The Committee may want to identify a threshold for the number of nominations to advance to the Review Panel. GAA has the Council Committee review all nominations and advances a pool of finalists. In the 2020 GAA process, ten finalists rose from the 69 nominated. In the 2018 Poet Laureate process, there were 13 poets nominated. One nominated poet was ineligible, and one declined consideration, leaving 10 to be reviewed by the panel.

- Review Panel of five members from outside of the Council, selected by the Committee
- Review Panel to discuss nominees with scores due following the discussion
- Staff will provide a ranked list to the Committee

Recommendation Development

- Council Committee uses review panel ranking and comments to determine recommendations
- Committee Chair submits a recommendation memo to the Council as part of June 2021 meeting materials to include submission materials from recommended poets and a list of nominations received

Job Description with Reimbursement Plan

Job Description

The Montana Poet Laureate is an honorary position with no official duties and no compensation from the state.

As part of the selection process, the Montana Arts Council (MAC) prioritizes poets that have demonstrated on-going contributions to the cultural community. This metric's emphasis identifies poets that will voluntarily leverage their Governor appointment to promote poetry appreciation.

The appointed Poet Laureate will have access to the following opportunities:

- Contributions to the MAC State of the Arts newspaper published quarterly
- Inclusion in the Humanities Montana Speaker's Bureau program
- Engagement with the Montana Poetry Out Loud program

Within the limitations set in law, MAC can reimburse expenses related to engagement that meets MAC's mission and priorities. Reimbursements are limited to those allowed to state officials as laid out in the Montana Operations Manual. MAC has allocated up to \$ (to be determined by the Committee) for public presentations that serve the following:

- Federally recognized tribes
- Tribal colleges
- Community colleges
- Public broadcast programs
- Communities with a population of less than (to be set by the Committee)
- Communities more than (to be set by the Committee) miles from a population center of (to be set by the Committee) people
- Organizations and entities outside of traditional arts and literature audiences
- Service organization such as Lions, Rotary, and Kiwanis

The Poet Laureate is encouraged to determine the appropriateness of eligibility before the event. Reimbursement requests must be submitted before May 30 of each calendar year and within 30 days of the end of the appointment.
